- 2. Then put into a SEPARATE bin:

~ papers ~ flattened cardboard ~

Required Recycling

PAPERS:

- Office paper and Junk mail
- Paper bags
- Catalogs and Magazines
- Phone books & Paperback books
- **Newspapers**
- Envelopes with or without windows
- Flatten Paper egg cartons, Containerboard, Cardboard, Rolls & Tubes

GLASS: Rinse out: Jars and Bottles



CANS: Rinse out:

- Aluminum (do not crush)
- Steel (push partially attached lid into the can)
- Empty Aerosol (remove nozzle)



PLASTIC 23 Bottles & Jugs

ASEPTIC BOXES & PAPER CARTONS:

Soup, milk, broth, orange juice, soy milk, etc. Discard plastic caps. Do not remove spouts. Flatten



These #1-#5 PLASTIC CONTAINERS:

Food, beverage, deli, ice cream, vogurt, cottage cheese, bakery, medicine and pill and kitty litter containers, brown beverage bottles, frozen food containers/trays.

#3 - #5 PLASTICS:

Flower pots or trays, clear/rigid clam shell packaging, 5 gal. pails, small toys. Must fit into bin.



Do Not Leave The Following at the Curh:

- plastic 55-gallon drums
- large plastic furniture (chairs, tables, etc.)
- large plastic toys (playhouses, slides, etc.)

They may be taken to the Solid Waste Department for Recycling.

Do Not Put into

- Plastic film or shrink wrap
- Plastic bags
- Plastic straws, plates, or silverware
- Drink pouches
- Styrofoam (egg cartons, plates, hot beverage cups, formed packing pieces, or packing peanuts)
- Aluminum baking pans or foil
- Liners (metal or plastic)
- Mirror or window glass
- Motor oil containers
- Light bulbs
- Ceramics or Clay pots
- Soiled papers (tissues, towels, cardboard, etc.)
- **Batteries**
- CD cases
- Vinyl siding, etc.
- Food
